Description

The texts were acquired on the antiquities market in 1925 by A. Boak and/or D.L. Askren.¹ The papyri in the family archive of Horos, son of Patous jr., are written in Demotic and are for the major part unpublished. They documents are dated between 199 and 184 BC and at least some of them are linked with the village of Philadelpheia. The archive informs us about two generations. In 199 BC Patous jr., a servant of Hathor mistress of Aphroditopolis, married Nebyotis. _ Thirteen years later, in 186 BC, Patous jr. sells half a house in Philadelpheia to his daughter-in-law Tikas. In 184 BC the same Tikas gives as security for a loan the same half house to the farmer _ Horos, son of the previous owner Patous jr. Apparently the mortgage is immediately turned over into a sale. The house changes owners within one family. This becomes clear in the last stage, where Peteharmotnis, the husband of Tikas, confirms the deed of his wife. He is another son of Patous jr. and had inherited his father's title 'servant of Hathor mistress of Aphroditopolis'. Probably the archive ended up in the hands of Horos, son of Patous jr.: he is now the owner of the house and therefore also of the title deeds concerning it.
