Description

This very small archive consists of two papyri. One text was unearthed during the excavations of 1891 and was brought to the Cairo Museum, the other one turned up on the antiquities market as a result of illicit trade and was sold to the British Museum (later: Library) in 1895. The belonging of P. Lond. III 888B, a Greek loan contract of Nechouthes' father Pelaias alias Areios from 139-138 B.C., to the archive remains uncertain since it is equally possible that this contract was kept in the archive of his other son Patous (father of Pakoibis, see Vandorpe and Waebens, *Reconstructing Pathyris' Archives* (2009), §43).

Nechouthes alias Almaphis, son of Pelaias, was a brother of Patous, son of Pelaias, whose documents have been preserved in the archive of his son Pakoibis (Vandorpe and Waebens, *Reconstructing Pathyris' Archives* (2009), §43). He belongs to a family of *agoranomoi*, whose members are well-known from other texts.¹


In 132/131 B.C., Nechouthes wrote a petition concerning a lease problem (P. Cairo II 30976). An undated letter, written by a Psenenoupis and addressed to Nechouthes and his brother Pakoibis, also belongs to the archive (P. Bingen p. 190 [BM 45] descr.). According to the unpublished ostrakon O. Tempeleide p. 395 DO OI IN 6961, Pates, son of Nechouthes (reading uncertain), swore an oath to Nechouthes in 94/93 B.C.
